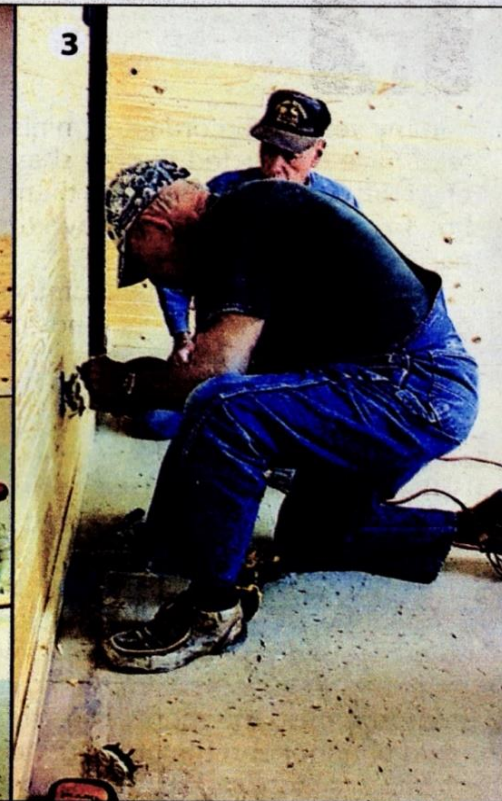
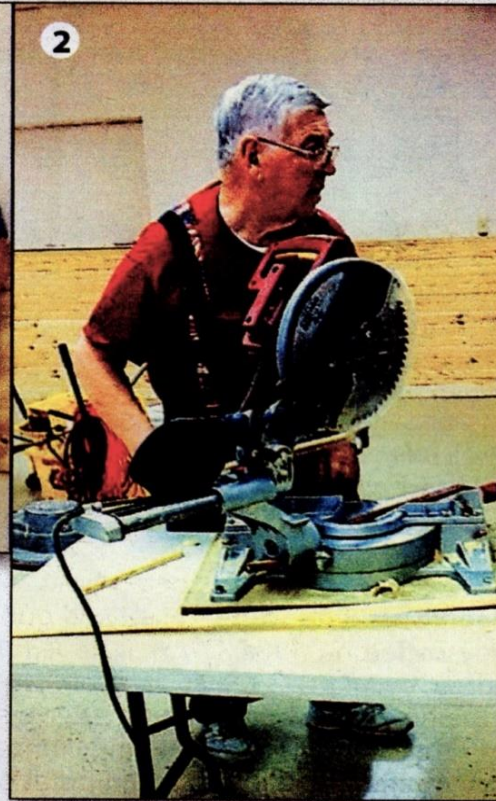


# Missions & ministry: Campers on Mission serve at CrossTimbers
